### Mark—The Gospel of God's Servant Revised and Expanded

This is a self-study course designed to help you discover for yourself some important truths from the gospel of Mark.

### how to study the lesson

- 1. Try to find a quiet spot free from distractions and noise.
  - 2. Read each question carefully.
- 3. Look up the Scripture reference given after each question. Make sure you have found the correct Scripture passage. For example, sometimes you will find yourself looking up JOHN 1:1 instead of 1 JOHN 1:1.
- 4. Answer the question from the appropriate Bible passage. Write, in your own words, a phrase or sentence to answer the question. In questions that can be answered with a "yes" or "no" always give the reason for your answer... "Yes, because...."
- 5. If possible, keep a dictionary handy in order to look up words you don't understand.

- 3. When you think you are ready to take the self-check test, do so without looking up the answers.
- 4. Check your answers to the self-check test carefully with the answer key given on page 77.
- 5. If you have any questions wrong, your answer key will tell you where to find the correct answer in your lesson. Go back and locate the right answers. Learn by your mistakes!

# apply what you have learned to your own life

In this connection, read carefully James 1:22-25. It is only as you apply your lessons to your own life that you will really grow in grace and increase in the knowledge of God.

#### Introduction to Mark

Mark is preeminently the gospel of service and presents the Lord Jesus Christ as the servant obedient unto death (see Phillipians 2:7-8). The servant character of the Lord Jesus is shown throughout the book and is clearly stated in 10:45. Particular emphasis is given to the miracles that the Lord Jesus performed, thus demonstrating His deity. Jesus is seen primarily as a Worker rather than as a Teacher.

Mark wrote primarily for the Gentiles who were not familiar with the Old Testament prophecies. Therefore, he used only a few Old Testament references (1:2-3; 14:27; 15:28). Mark is noted for its brevity and its vividness.

The author was a relative of Barnabas and a companion of Paul in his later ministry. The date of the gospel is somewhere between A.D. 57 and 63.
